## Rethoric Tournament

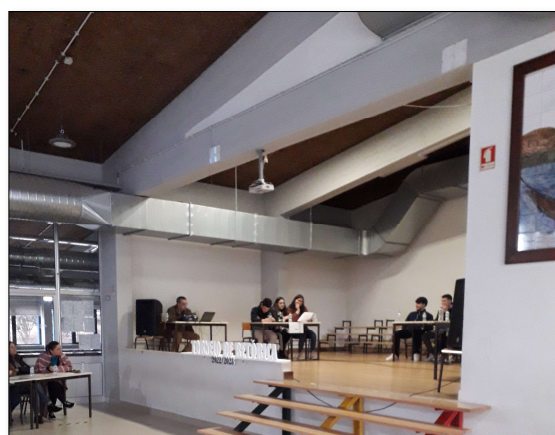
On January 19, we participated in the inter-class Rhetoric Tournament.

"Sport Hunting" was our theme and we presented arguments against it, namely:

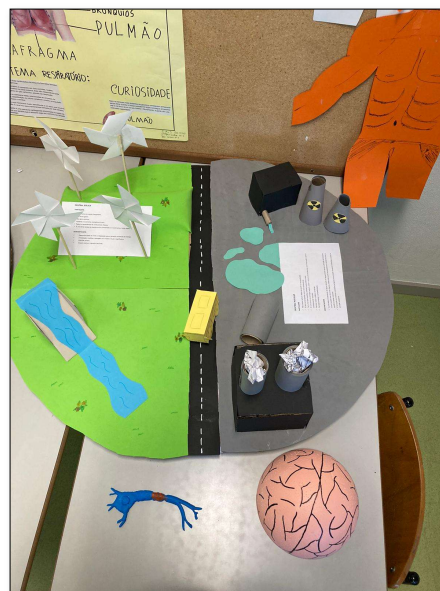
- the death of animals and plant species;
